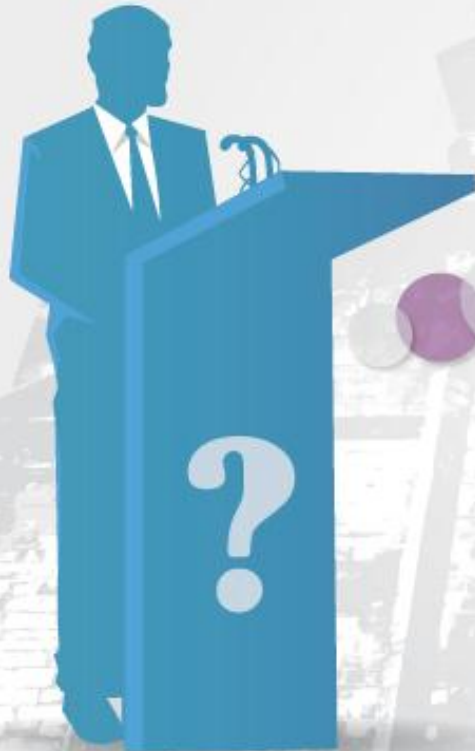
“ We have been able to generate simulations collaboratively with stakeholders, thus improving our energy policy. This could lead us to decrease our energy bill. ”

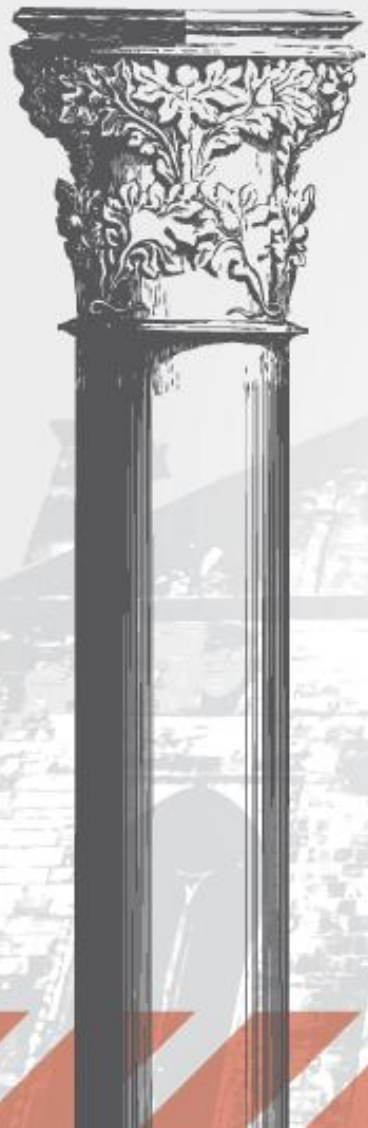
